#### **VECKANS ENGELSKA**

Veckans Engelska består av tre delar, Pick and Choose, In The World of English och The News Quiz.

**Pick and Choose** är övningsuppgifter som i första hand riktar sig till årskurs 3-5. Varje vecka publiceras två uppgifter.

In The World of English (åk. 5 och uppåt) består av en enklare och en svårare uppgift som ofta berör aktuella händelser från engelsktalande länder världen över. Uppgifterna syftar till att väcka elevers nyfikenhet och intresse att vilja lära sig mer. På ett lättsamt sätt tar materialet avstamp i läroplanen (LGR22) som framhåller i såväl centralt innehåll som betygskriterier att elever ska fokusera på förhållanden i olika sammanhang där det engelska språket används.

Materialets tredje del är *The News Quiz* (åk. 6 och uppåt) som är nutidsfrågor på engelska. I första hand försöker vi välja nutidsfrågor som berör den engelskspråkiga världen men som även har fått utrymme i den svenska nyhetsrapporteringen. Användare av vårat populära SO-material Veckans Nutidsfrågor känner igen konceptet mycket väl.

Oavsett ålder eller kunskapsnivå handlar språkundervisning mycket om att läsa, förstå och tala eller skriva språket. Det är också det som de olika delarna i *Veckans Engelska* trots sina olika målgrupper och inbördes olikheter har gemensamt.





## Can nuclear technology save the rhinos?

For many years, illegal hunting has been a severe issue in South Africa, posing a significant threat to wildlife and rhinos in particular. Driven by the high demand for rhino horns in illegal markets, poachers hunt them across the nation. Despite stringent anti-poaching laws and conservation efforts, the lucrative black market continues to fuel this illegal trade. The loss of these majestic creatures not only disrupts ecosystems but also undermines conservation efforts and tourism, a vital part of South Africa's economy. This persistent problem highlights the urgent need for innovative solutions.



Such a solution has now been initiated. In a groundbreaking effort to stop poaching in South Africa, scientists have devised a new strategy that allows rhinos to keep their horns. Surprisingly, the secret recipe is radiation. Scientists have started implanting radioactive material in rhinos' horns. This material emits detectable radiation, enabling authorities to identify anyone who has come into contact with a rhino horn at border checkpoints.

Radiation detectors has already been set up at national borders to find rhino horns and help catch poachers. This method offers a significant advantage, as the radiation persists on the horn and anything it touches, even if the tracking device is removed. Throughout the year, veterinarians and nuclear experts have worked together in this research project and in 2024 they have already helped 20 rhinos. Hopefully, this method will make sure poachers stay far away from the precious animals.
